#### Academy

For some time, the local pyramid of schools has been involved in discussions about how we could work together more closely to improve the education of our children. As a result, the governors have been considering the creation of our own multi academy trust for our area, consisting of our local primaries and secondary school. A letter was sent out on **21**<sup>st</sup> **October** inviting parents to a meeting on the **7**<sup>th</sup> **November 2016**. There were approximately half a dozen representatives from our parental body at this meeting. This is clearly an important decision affecting children in our community and we would welcome your support in ensuring we reach the right decision for the school and community. We are therefore planning to offer further opportunities for you to share your views and thoughts. The first of these is our termly Parent Forum meeting on the **21**<sup>st</sup> **November at 6pm**.
