

Please take a moment to read our 'Behaviour Policy' to help ensure the whole community have a shared understanding of the procedures and systems we use, in order to keep everyone safe and the consequences, should children exhibit unacceptable levels of behaviour.

We are fortunate at St Nicholas to have a body of children, who for the majority of the time, take responsibility for their behaviour, are forgiving and willing to help those, who at times, find things difficult. We are proud of this ethos and would welcome your support in maintaining and strengthening it. Thank you.
