#### **School Uniform**

Please make sure that everything is named with nametapes, not pen which fades and becomes illegible.

Our uniform is a burgundy sweatshirt or a cardigan, embroidered with the school's logo.

Dark grey trousers (no leggings please) /skirts with white polo tops complement the sweatshirts or cardigans. Red gingham dresses and can be worn in warmer weather.

We prefer traditional styles for shoes, as they are safer for children.

Please could you make sure children wear plain grey, black or white socks.

We also have a smart and practical school fleece for warmer weather and a waterproof jacket for winter.

(All of these items can be ordered from the school office)

Long hair should be tied back

No elaborate hair accessories.

No make-up!

Stud earrings only.

In the Summer Term, we also ask children to bring in a named hat to protect them from the summer sun. Sun cream should be applied before school.
