#### Making a Splash!



Nine Year 6 pupils represented the school in a swimming gala at St Mary's School in Shaftesbury on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November. This was the first time the school had entered a team in this event and we were very proud of their achievements: The swimmers performed superbly, gaining 8 firsts (including all 4 relays), 3 seconds, and 1 third, 3 fourths and a fifth place. Despite having such a small team and not having any Year 5 entries, St Nicholas managed to secure 4th place overall (out of 8). This was a truly fantastic achievement! Congratulations to all team members and thanks to families for supporting their children in the development of their swimming.



#### School Development Priorities

I sent out a summary of our key priorities at the beginning of the term and we have been working hard on these areas of development. A copy of this summary can be found on our website in the Parents - Newsletters section.



I have carried out many maths learning walks this term as well as formal lesson observations and real progress is being made! The children are displaying an increasing ability to articulate their thinking, identify patterns and make connections between concepts. In many cases the children are thirsty for challenge and eager to be tested on their times tables and related division facts. There is indeed a real buzz about maths throughout the school.

As you know we are working hard to develop their fluency in the basic skills and are grateful for all your efforts in helping us to achieve this. Please keep practising those all-important tables and number bonds, it is making a real difference! '**Time**' is another tricky concept for many children so any support you can offer would be welcomed too. The parent leaflet, posted on your child's class page at the beginning of the year, is a good reference point, if you wish to support your child further in achieving the end of expectations.

At parent consultations in December staff will outline your child's next steps in Reading, Writing and Maths, suggesting further ways you can help at home – together we can make a significant difference!

## Behaviour and Staying Safe.

As you know, we expect the highest standards of behaviour at St Nicholas and are committed to ensuring all the children feel happy and safe. Incidents of bullying or indeed any acts of unkindness are treated seriously and dealt with directly, as stated in our Behaviour and Anti-Bullying Policies. We aim to be proactive rather than reactive. Through our PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education) and Citizenship Curriculum, we aim to develop positive relationships, respect and tolerance for others, emotional intelligence and resilience, in order to help children recognise and manage their own and others emotions. We are relentless in our efforts to minimise unkind acts and bullying on a daily basis and to developing the necessary skills, knowledge and aptitudes the children need to deal with such behaviour, including knowing when and how to seek appropriate support. The children are always the first item on all our staff meeting agendas and we endeavour to be vigilant at all times but it is impossible to be 'all seeing and all-knowing'. Therefore please help us to maintain the highest standards of behaviour and prevent bullying by: reinforcing what is and isn't acceptable behaviour, discussing the difference between isolated acts of unkindness and bullying and encouraging your child to talk to someone if they feel hurt or upset. Many thanks.

## <u>E-Safety</u>

Keeping our children safe on the internet is also something that should concern us all. In school, we talk to the children on a regular basis about 'Cyber bullying' and how to keep themselves safe on the internet, using age appropriate material. Our Safer Schools Team ran workshops last week for our KS2 pupils and a few parents attended an information session after school. We have posted guidance from this session on our website, for those who were unable to attend. You will find this information on the Home Page under Web Safety. As one parent aptly pointed out, 'it is something we should attend annually because our children continue to age, the technology changes and sadly the potential

threats to our children's safety seem to increase.' Please take the time to read this guidance and regularly check your child's settings and activity.

## Parking



Some of you may have noticed the presence of community police officers at pick up and

drop off times. Unfortunately, there are still people who continue to park on the yellow zig zag lines in front of the school and in the designated disabled spaces outside the school office. Could I once again ask everyone to be considerate when parking and driving near school, in order to minimise the risks to our children and keep everyone safe. Many thanks.

We held our first Musical Café of the year on Friday. For several of the children this was their first experience of performing in front of an audience and they did

themselves proud! There was wonderful singing from our Junior and Senior Choirs too! Many thanks to all our peripatetic teachers and Mrs Horner and Mr Blake for their boundless energy and encouragement.
