## Introducing Millie - a three-year-old cockapoo.

Following a rigorous interview process, including all the necessary risk assessments, we are excited to announce that, Millie has been appointed by the governing body to lead pet 'therapy' at St Nicholas.

Millie is an extremely placid, gentle and sociable dog owned by Mrs Salisbury. She has been brought up in a busy household where she has had contact with a wide variety of people (including young children) and other pets. She is exceptionally good natured and enjoys giving and receiving attention.


The value of pet 'therapy' is widely accepted as a powerful aid to stimulation and communication. Studies have shown that the presence of companion animals can improve the well-being of children and lower the rate of anxiety, simply by making the environment happier, more enjoyable and less forbidding.

Millie will initially be in school 2 days a week and her primary job is to support the emotional well - being of the children by sitting and playing with them or taking them out for on a walk, with Mrs Salisbury.

It is accepted that interacting with animals is not appropriate for all children but that for most it has the potential to provide many positive benefits. Any parent who does not wish their child to interact with Millie is invited to write to inform Mrs Maley of their wishes.

Our risk assessment will be reviewed annually and the school senior leadership team will evaluate the impact of a school dog on a regular basis.

We are all looking forward to welcoming Millie after Easter.



#### **Sport**
