2017 proved to be a very positive one for St Nicholas CE VA Primary School. In the recently published performance tables we are ranked the 8th best school in Dorset based on our overall performance and progress scores. (There are 179 Primary Schools in Dorset)

Particular areas where we can work together for the good of our children include ensuring that:

* they receive regular support with homework and do not become slaves to their phones and electronic devices!

* **Reading to and with your child regularly**, whatever their age. We work hard to cultivate a love of reading at St Nicholas and are proud to report that the vast majority of our children (including our boys) read for pleasure! Developing a love a literature is one of the greatest gifts we can give a child. Stories help to boost language, develop abstract thoughts, feed imaginations and build relationships. By limiting their exposure to stories, we limit their potential and thus opportunities. Please help us to keep their thirst for books alive by reading to and with your child regularly. Thank you

* we actively and collectively encourage them to adopt healthy lifestyles (eating and sleeping well and getting plenty of regular exercise)

*we continue to encourage them to aim high and to aspire '**to be the very best that they can be**' (understanding that real success only comes through hard work and commitment)

Undoubtedly, there will be times when we make mistakes but we will endeavour to learn from these, and in doing so strengthen our school.

Our value this half term is: **COMPASSION**. The children will be exploring this value, through stories and discussion to deepened their understanding of its importance.

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<u>Keeping Safe On-Line</u> - As you know, keeping children safe is our top priority at St Nicholas. Ensuring our children are safe on social media sites is particularly challenging and we regularly deliver discrete lessons on e-safety to help children understand the dangers. During these sessions, we encourage children to share any concerns they may have with a trusted adult. I am heartened to report that our children are now beginning to do this, in a very responsible, sensitive way that allows us to reinforce the safety guidelines and alert parents. When the children demonstrate this kind of understanding and regard for their own and others safety, we know we have succeeded in creating a safe culture in our school, where everyone understands their responsibilities! Well done children!

Please, help us to keep our safeguarding procedures and processes robust by regularly checking what apps and games your child is playing, who they are talking to and what information they are sharing. **Do you know the answers to these questions?**
