Vision Statement

- Further strengthen our Full Governing Body and accountability amongst all stakeholders.

- Continue to involve the children in assessing their own and others' learning.

Pupil Outcomes: Achievements and Standards

- Progress is at least good for ALL groups, with a particular focus on boys' progress.
- Sustain improvement in Phonics and increase the percentage achieving the standard by the end of Year 2
- To continue to improve outcomes for the more able and those with the potential to exceed expectations in maths, writing and reading.

Behaviour and Safety and Well Being of our Pupils

- To ensure Safeguarding Procedures remain Outstanding
- To further increase the children's responsibility for their own learning and behaviour, by developing our peer mentoring programme.
- To improve whole school attendance, especially of our more vulnerable pupils (whole school target for 2017-18 is 97.1%)
