### **Important Information for September**

As you know we are already a 'nut free' school, so we would like to remind you that we do have children in school who have allergies to nuts. So please can you think carefully about what you put in their lunch boxes. In addition to this we have a child who is starting with us who also has a significant allergy to milk. This is also a touch allergy, which means if they touch any milk or milk based products then they will have an allergic reaction.

We will therefore have to have some changes to some of our routines but the most significant one is that all children and adults will be required to wash their hands more often, particularly after eating, to minimise the risk of transmition. Also, if anyone spills any liquid milk based product on their clothing we will require them to change out of

it due to the high risk of transmittion.

These changes have been advised through discussions with Health professionals and need to be put in place in order to minimise the risk of a severe reaction.

#### **The School Day**

Please ensure your child arrives at school by **8.40 am**, ready for registration at 8.45 am. From September Worship will be starting at 8.50 am.

Miss Brooks will be joining us as Chestnuts new teacher in September. The children have had a chance to meet with her already on Transition Day and she also came in for another day last week.

#### **School Uniform**

We believe that school uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of our school. The aim of our school uniform is to present a smart appearance that promotes a sense of belonging and pride in our school. We thank parents for supporting our Uniform Policy.

Children should not wear jewellery to school as a matter of safety, also we cannot accept responsibility for such items. The only exception is for children with pierced ears. Under these circumstances plain studs may be worn as long as pupils are able to remove them themselves for PE. The best option is not to wear them on PE days.

Older children in Key Stage 2 may wear watches, which must be removed before PE or swimming lessons, and for which the child remains entirely responsible.

Make-up, including nail polish, is not appropriate in school. Haircuts should be neat and tidy. Extreme haircuts are discouraged.

#### **Term Time Holidays**

School attendance is vital and the school's attendance figures are closely monitored by the Local Authority and Ofsted. In accordance with Dorset Council Pentalty Notice Protocol, children who are taken out of school for a period of 10 sessions (5days) or more will be referred to the Attendance Team in Children's Services.

This may then result in a Penalty notice (fine) being issued.

#### **School Structure**

As you know we are lucky that we are going to be able to have 6 classes in school next year. This means we will have a Year R, 1, 2, 3, 4/5 and 5/6.

As Year 3 are officially part of KS2 they will now join the routines and structures in the upper part of the school. So Acorns, Chestnuts and Willows will work together as EYFS/KS1 and Ash, Acres and Oaks will together as KS2.
