We are now finally entering December, and the children are looking forward to the festive season!

In English the children have finished writing their Christmas dessert adverts, where they explored persuasive language, rhetorical questions and adding urgency into their writing. The last topic before Christmas is based on a film unit 'Marshmallow', the children will be building up to writing their own adventure story based on the video.

In Maths, we are beginning to look at our Multiplication and Division topic. Please make sure to practice your times tables at home to help the children apply this to their learning.

In Science, the children have really enjoyed our experiments based on sound. They recently took part in an experiment to measure how the volume of sound changes as you move away from a sound source. During the next couple of weeks, we will be further investigating volume and pitch.

In History, we have moved on from the Anglo Saxons and have begun learning about Viking invasions and how these changed Britain.

The children had a great time exploring packaging as part of our DT topic 'Fresh food, good food'. Over the next couple of weeks, the children will be designing and making a fruit salad as a healthy snack. The children will be enjoying the fruit salads they have made during the afternoon, please let me know if you do not want your child to take part in this.
