They have shown a great understanding of the scientific causes of tsunamis and the effects they can create. They have also been working really hard to input similes into their work to help paint a picture for the reader.

In Maths, the children have been measuring in mm's, cm's and m's and have now moved on to comparing, adding and subtracting lengths. They particularly enjoyed measuring each other's heights and comparing their data. In the last week of term we will be looking at how to measure perimeters.

In Science, we have been sorting and classifying animals and plants. The children have learnt how to recognise different vertebrates and invertebrates and successfully classified these.

They have particularly enjoyed using the computers to investigate rivers on google maps.
