Maths

In Maths, Reception have been learning about 3D shapes, complex patterns and looking at the artwork of Andy Goldsworthy. Next week we will begin looking at numbers beyond 10.

Year 1 have been learning about measuring accurately with a ruler in centimetres and will begin learning about mass and volume next week.

Literacy

In Literacy we are continuing to look at non-fiction books including *The Big Book of Bugs*.

We will be using these to write facts and questions about the environment around us and the animals that we share the earth with.

We will also use our music sessions this week to inspire some sentences using onomatopoeia (the dinosaur's feet went boom, crash, thump!)

Topic

Our topic this term is 'Dangerous Dinosaurs', and we have been drawing and describing our favourite dinosaurs, creating maps to Dinosaur Island and making moving model of dinosaurs using split pins for the joints!
