In English we have been writing our own Mountain poems based on the poem 'The River' by Valerie Bloom. The children have been working hard to include metaphors, rhyme and powerful adjectives into their writing and have produced some lovely work.

In Maths, we are currently working on our Mass and Capacity topic and have begun this by measuring in grams and kilograms. The children have quickly grasped how to use and read scales and how to interpret intervals on a scale. We will be moving on to comparing mass, before exploring capacity and volume.

In Science, the children have shown lots of curiosity towards our States of Matter topic. They enjoyed learning about unusual materials and most recently about particle theory, where they explored the particles that make up solids, liquids and gases. The children loved using hula hoops to demonstrate this practically.

In Geography, we have carried on learning about mountains, and the children took part in their own research to learn more about a chosen mountain in the UK and a Mountain of the world. They learnt lots of interesting facts to share with the class.

We are continuing to enjoy our class novel 'James and the Giant Peach', thank you for sending in any copies from home. It's so lovely to see all the children's engagement in the story and their enthusiasm to find out what is going to happen next!
